QR CODE BACKUP:
Use QR codes to find routes before the storm, but print directions in advance. Phones, data, and power may fail during an evacuation.

Always follow local evacuation orders and official shelter information.

Flood & Storm Surge Risk

Water is one of the biggest hurricane dangers.

Flooding can happen from storm surge, heavy rain, overflowing canals or rivers, blocked drains, or low roads. This page helps your family think about water risk before you have to make decisions quickly.

SAFETY FIRST!

Never walk, bike, or drive through floodwater. You may not see the depth, current, holes, debris, or downed power lines.

Turn Around, Don't Drown. Avoid floodwater and follow local road closures
